Jarislowsky Institute for Studies in Canadian Art*, as well as recipient of the 2015 Governor General's award in the category of French non-fiction for his work, *Honoré Beaugrand: la plume et l'épée (1848-1906)*.

He is a specialist in the history and sociology of 20th century Quebec.

« L'importance de la pensée historique chez les jeunes : l'histoire essentielle à la formation citoyenne et professionnelle » (conference in French)

Brief introduction by Dr. Stéphane Lévesque followed by a plenary discussion.

Stéphane Lévesque is Associate Professor of history education and Director of the Virtual History Lab (VH Lab) at the Faculty of Education, University of Ottawa. In the fall of 2011, he was visiting professor of digital history at Umea University in Sweden. His research focuses on students' historical thinking and consciousness, Canadian history, citizenship education, and new media and technology in education. In the early spring of 2011, Dr. Lévesque opened the Virtual Historian Laboratory (VH Lab). Funded by CFI, this is the first research center in Canada to study on-line learning of history.
